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Dear Rumboldswhyke families,

This week there has been great excitement in the air as we approach the festive season. Both classes have embarked on new learning experiences which culminate in our visit to the Festival Theatre on the 14th December and Red classes performance of 'Lights, Camel, Action: The sequin' on the 16th December.

Red Class Christmas Production

On Monday, **Red Class** emerged through the iridescent curtains to a kaleidoscope of lights and the Strictly Come Dancing theme tune. **Lights, Camel, Action: The Sequin** rehearsals are now underway. It is so lovely to hear the excited chatter, a chorus of songs and sounds of dancing feet fill the school after the absence of performances.



We are hoping to stage two performances on the 16th December for parents. This will depend on Covid numbers in the school community. We have been advised by Public Health England and West Sussex County Council, to monitor the situation closely before putting on any large gatherings. (Please see attached letter from the Director of Education). Therefore, we are planning to go ahead with live audiences but this may change depending on any confirmed cases. We will be asking the audience to wear face coverings and follow government advice on administering a lateral flow test before visiting a busy space.

At present, tickets are limited to two (in total) per family. This is to limit numbers on site and to ensure every child is able to have at least one person watching each performance. Parents have the option to request either 2 tickets for the afternoon performance, or 2 tickets for the evening performance or one of each. We have also given parents the opportunity to request additional tickets which will be allocated nearer the time if our risk assessment allows this. Children in Blue class will get the opportunity to see the production in school time as they will make up the audience for the dress rehearsal. Children are welcome to come along to the performances but will count in the two-ticket limit.

Blue Class Nativity Service

A reminder that we have planned for our Nativity service to take place in St. George's Church at 10am on Friday 10th December. The service will be led by Fr. John and the children of Blue Class; therefore, we are inviting the parents/carers of the children in Blue Class to join us. To mitigate Covid risks we need to limit numbers in church so two family members per child are welcome to come along to the service. We politely ask you wear a face mask at this event.
