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Attendance

This year one of our main school improvement priorities is attendance. After a month at school our attendance is looking greatly improved and above National attendance figures. Thank you so much for continued support and a huge well done to Yellow Class with 97.2% attendance so far this year!

As a school we aspire to **high standards of attendance** from all pupils and parents and strive to build a culture where all can, and want to, be in school and ready to learn. The law entitles every child of compulsory school age to an efficient, full time education. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives that education. **Good attendance is learned behaviour so it is important to develop good patterns of attendance from the outset.**

Monitoring

The DfE expects schools to monitor and analyse weekly attendance patterns and trends in order to intervene and support where attendance does not meet the required level. School has clear procedures in place to monitor attendance.

If your child is absent from school, you should contact school before 8.45am, and leave a message providing the child's full name, reason for absence and the anticipated length of the absence.

School monitoring

If your child arrives after 8.45am they will be marked as late. If they have not arrived by 9:15am and there is no reason provided for absence then you will receive a phone call requesting a reason. If absence isn't notified and / or confirmed further contact will be made by contacting additional named emergency contacts to ensure safeguarding. An unauthorised absence will be noted on the register.

Unauthorised absences may lead to enforcement action by the Local Authority.

As a school we systematically analyse school attendance data to identify pupils that may need support. Where school begins to have concerns about a child's attendance we will initiate school-led support.

For any leave of absence, parents are required to write a letter with details of the dates their child will be absent and should explain the reasons for their absence. School can only grant a leave of absence in exceptional circumstances.





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Hand Sanitiser & Medication

Please **do not** send your child into school with hand sanitiser. The school has a supply that all children have access if they wish to use it.

Also, please remember that no medicines, throat sweets, lip balm or ointments of any kind, should be brought to the school by the children.

Some medicines are required to be given regularly to enable a child to attend school. First Aiders are able to administer this, provided it has been agreed by the Head of School and a 'Parental Request for Rumboldswhyke Church of England Primary School to Administer Medicine' form has been completed. If this is on-going medication, a Health Care Plan may also be required.

All prescribed medicines should be given to the First Aiders/School Office in their original containers with the child's name, date of birth and dose as dispensed by the pharmacist.

No medicine should <u>ever</u> be left in school bags

School Drop Off

A child was hurt with a piece of bamboo this morning at drop off time. Please ensure that your child does not pick up anything from the drive and use it as a toy. Please may you also ensure that they stay with you at all times as staff cars may be damaged. Thank you for your understanding.
