The children in Yellow Class have been learning about how the curriculum at school helps us stay safe at home too. They have particularly been focussing on 'how to stay safe online'.

I feel even as adults we can never have enough education about the online world. The internet is essential in 21st century life. As children move up through the school, their access to various types of technology increases and it stands to reason that their exploration and curiosity increases too. My children can certainly do things with technology that I cannot fully comprehend.

The positives of the digital world overwhelmingly outweigh the negatives, but children, schools and parents all need to be aware of online risks.

Over the week, staff have been asking children about their online habits and what they would do if they saw something they did not like or knew they should not be looking at. It was surprising how many children said they knew what they should do but they wouldn't as if they spoke to a grown up their device would be taken away from them.

There is also an increase in the number of children (as young as 5) who are becoming increasingly worried about their self-image. Whilst I love to play with apps that can make me look 20 years younger, or 10lbs slimmer, this is damaging to impressionable minds and sets a dangerous precedent in how we should look.

Please ensure you monitor what your children are playing and watching online. Play the games with them and discuss what they are watching. Remember YouTube is also a type of social media which anyone with an account can post on. I have included information on some of the most popular online games that we have heard children at

Numbots – app/website (£7.20 per year for up to 3 children) Engaging platform for learning to add and subtract. NumBots recommend hildren start using between the ages of – 7 years old.



YouTube Kids (4+)

YouTube Kids was created to give children a more contained environment Remember not all videos have been manually reviewed so if you do find something then flag it for fast review.



Duolingo - Language Lessons (4+) Learn a new language or your child can practice what they're learning in school This app is free although a paid subscription is available for further functionality and no ads.
