Just this week, a family member nearly knocked a child over whilst reversing away from the gates. It should not take an accident to stop parents from committing what is a driving offense!

'It is an offense to stop or wait in your vehicle outside a school where the road is marked with yellow zig-zag lines during restricted times. If you do, you could be fined.'
