Firstly though, I would just like to say how proud we are of our local hero Emily, who has been chosen to turn on the Christmas lights in Chichester on Saturday 25th November.


Last year, Emily demonstrated bravery and courage when her mum had a medical emergency at home.

Uniform donations

We are looking for donations of some uniform and / or PE items (in particular socks, tights and plimsols). If anyone has any spare or old uniform they no longer use or need, we would be very grateful for any donations!



As our school grows, it has come to my attention, that some children are *creating and uploading their* own content on YouTube. Children must be at

least 13 years old to use the service. Some children are giving away personal information, such as their name and age in their user names,



and they have been encouraging comments on their content which has caused disagreements in school.

We regularly teach about personal information and online safety in school. We are in the process of arranging for our local Police liaison officer to visit and carry out a workshop on social media in Green Class.

Please ensure you supervise your children online, keeping a careful watch on what your children are accessing and (in some cases) possibly uploading.

- Check age ratings of sites / games they are using.
- Check their usernames do they give away any personal information which could identify them?
- Are they uploading photographic or video content?
- Are they commenting on online content?

Remind them that anything they post online remains online forever! Even if they delete it, someone may have already taken a screenshot.

If we work together on this, we can keep children safe online and free from any unkindness or misunderstanding.

Watching videos online: what parents and carers need to know

Watching videos is one of the most popular ways children and young people consume content online. 91% of 5-15-year olds watch video-on-demand content online and 97% use video sharing platforms, with YouTube being the most used platform.

There are many reasons why children might enjoy this online activity. Videos can be entertaining, funny, creative or educational. From silly animal videos to slime-making or video-game tutorials, the internet has it all. But the amount and availability of content children of all ages can enjoy does increase the risk that they may see something inappropriate.

What can I do to help keep my child safe when watching videos?

Sleep Advice

At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

Our free helpline is run by trained sleep advisors, many of whom are specialists in working with SEND. We can talk to young people directly, or parents (we can also talk to adults, including older people, about their sleep issues).

The helpline is open 5 times a week, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday evenings 7-9pm, and Monday, Wednesday mornings 9-11am. The number is 03303 530 541.
