Dear Rumboldswhyke families,

Can you believe that today marks the halfway point of the academic year? Time does fly when you are having fun.

Thank you to all the parents who managed to attend parents' evening this week. It was very well attended, in fact it was probably the busiest parents' evening we've ever had.

A huge thank you if you completed and returned your questionnaire. We always appreciate your feedback as it can help us strive to provide the best education and care for your children. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive with some very valid suggestions for improvement.

I have attached the results of the questionnaire for you to look through. We received 50 responses, therefore each response is worth 2% of the respondents. It was lovely to see that 100% of respondents receive the weekly newsletter and would recommend the school to other parents. This is important as we receive applications through word of mouth. We no longer have a catchment so we do not come up in any catchment searches. Even if a resident of Rumbolds Close searched for their nearest catchment school, Rumboldswhyke would not show up!

The areas parents have requested improvement are as follows:

- communication of progress
- healthier lunches
- reward systems
- structured homework
- the Arbor App
- Wrap around care

We will certainly look at ways to improve these areas.

We are already in the process of reviewing homework. On our Inset day on Monday 19th February, we will be receiving training on building resilience in the children we work with and we will also be looking at our homework provision and developing a policy to suit our community. If you have not already completed the Google form on Homework, please do so this weekend. We only have 11 responses so far. Homework is something people often have strong opinions on so it would be very helpful to have your opinion too!

Some parents asked for further clarification on the rewards system in place. Currently, staff and children look and listen out for any children demonstrating one of our core values: love, compassion, respect, hope. They can then nominate a recipient for a core value certificate using the red postbox outside of the staff room. We encourage the children to articulate the reason for the nomination and state what that person did or said, rather than just stating they

were kind (we expect everyone to be kind ^(C)). Younger children are supported to do this. Certificates are issued every Friday during our celebration/singing worship.

This term, we have also been looking out for evidence of our monthly value, which for February is cooperation. Children who are noticed for this value get to add a coloured token into our celebration pot. The class with the most coloured tokens at the end of the month earns an additional playtime on Friday afternoon.

The school council has also been discussing ways to develop the reward system. So far we have discussed:

- a golden certificate for children who earn all four value certificates,
- hot chocolate and story/ game Friday with Mrs Harris,
- star of the week,



• sharing work in assembly for children who have gone above and beyond.
