Dear Rumboldswhyke families,




Hopefully the weather has begun to change and we will see more of the sun in the next few weeks. I have to applaud you on getting your children into school this week! I know some of you walk a long way and have

gotten soaked on more than one occasion. Why does it always choose to pour with rain at 8:30 and 3:15? Many of the children needed to get changed on arrival at school on Wednesday and Thursday and dry their clothing on the radiators. If your child has come home with clothing which does not belong to them please send it back in. Similarly, if your child is missing an item of clothing, please let us know.

<u>Homework</u>

Just before half term we asked you to complete a homework questionnaire. Thank you to those who were able to do this. It was really useful to read through your comments about homework and use these to set out our expectations on homework in our updated Homework guidelines (attached to this email).



The majority of parents believe homework is an important part of learning for children, if given in small chunks. Homework should **not** be a battle, and certainly should not be overwhelming.

However, it should help prepare children for secondary school and give parents an insight into what their child is learning at school so some consolidation activities can occur.

Most parents feel quite strongly that children should not be punished for non-completion of homework as this is up to parents to enforce. Having said that, school is here to provide opportunities for homework and support families overcome barriers with homework, if possible.

The expectation in all years is to read daily, this includes adults reading to children and discussing stories too. Developing a love of books and excitement about plot is crucial in enhancing children's vocabulary so please do continue to share books with them.

In Early Years and Key Stage 1 (Blue and Yellow Class), we will continue to use Seesaw to set homework. In KS2 (Red and Green Class), we are using a new platform called Atom Learning to set homework. https://atomlearning.com/ We will also be using a platform called TTRockstars https://ttrockstars.com/ to build up children's fluency with their times tables. Details of how to access these will be sent home with your child. Remember, you can use the class email accounts to email the teachers directly.
