I want to specifically highlight Green Class' Ted Talk Experience. Some Year 5/6 children from across the Bishop Luffa Learning Partnership met at Bishop Luffa School to have their

new learning experience introduced to them. They have been tasked with writing their own Ted Talk: a showcase for speakers to share their great well-informed ideas.



As part of the introduction, they were introduced to 7 year old Molly Wright. The youngest person ever to record a Ted Talk. What she said had me hooked and I think it is something every parent should watch. As a parent, I understand the impact of too much screen time on my child's mental health. I try to avoid allowing games / screen time before school and make sure she does not access it at least an hour before bedtime. I am also vigilant to what my child accesses online, however, this Ted Talk made me reflect on my own choices, my availability as a parent, and the impact this has on my child's self regulation and their social / emotional connectedness.

Thank you to the huge majority of you who ensure your child / children arrives each day wearing the specified school uniform.


Children are allowed to wear trainers on P.E. days **only**.
