Attendance Update

Well done! Our attendance is currently **above our** target of 96%, that's fantastic news! Good attendance supports better learning, wellbeing, and mental health. Being in school helps children develop academically, socially, and emotionally, with the support of teachers and friends.

Taking Children on Holiday During Term TimeBy law, all children of compulsory school age must receive a **full-time education**. Parents and carers are legally responsible for ensuring children attend school regularly.

The Department for Education states that **holidays during term time are not allowed**, and other absences may also be unacceptable, such as:

- A birthday
- Shopping trips or day trips
- Keeping children off school because a sibling is ill
- Not having uniform or suitable shoes/coats

If a child accrues 10 unauthorised sessions within a 10-week period (equivalent to five full days absent), the school is duty-bound to refer the case to the Pupil Entitlement Team for a possible Fixed Term Penalty Notice.



Keeping Children Safe Online: Understanding AI

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is technology that helps computers solve problems and make decisions. You'll already see it in everyday life e.g. in social media suggestions (the reason you are alerted to multiple

funny videos about pets), shopping sites, and route-planning apps.

Generative AI can create new content from a written prompt. Examples include:



- Chatbots like ChatGPT or Google Gemini (text generation)
- DALL-E or Midjourney (image creation)
- Text-to-video programs

While these tools can be fun and useful, they also come with risks.

Safequarding risks to children include:

- Scams and hacking: AI can help criminals write convincing messages to trick people, children in particular are vulnerable and can't distinguish between fact and fiction.
- Inappropriate images: AI tools can be misused to create fake images of children (including 'deepfakes') which can be used to manipulate children.
- Catfishing and sextortion: criminals use AI-generated photos to pose as young people and groom children
- Fake news: realistic AI-generated images can spread misinformation
- Unhealthy AI relationships: some chatbots encourage children to build intense, unsafe online attachments

Signs your child may be at risk:

- Spending more or less time online than usual
- Staying up very late online

- Receiving lots of messages and notifications
- Emotional outbursts after using devices
- Being secretive about online activity

How parents/carers can help at home:

- Talk about AI, its benefits and its risks
- Keep an eye on what your child is doing online (most apps have parental controls)
- Listen and support them if they share concerns, without blame

Together, we can help children enjoy the benefits of the internet while staying safe online.

<u>Bishop Luffa School – Admissions Guide (Year</u> 7, Sept 2026)



A number of parents have been to see me to enquire about the Bishop Luffa Admission Policy and whether this depends on **children's attendance** or whether **parental attendance at church** is considered.

One of the aims of the admissions arrangements is to **support family life**, and the school hopes that families will attend services together.

- If a child attends church regularly, this meets the conditions for Categories A and B.
- If the child cannot attend, **a parent or guardian's attendance counts**, as long as they are a full member of the church and hold *parental responsibility*.
- Parents do not have to live in the same household as the child for this to apply.
