# Exciting News: New School Houses & Taskmaster Club Launch!

We are thrilled to announce two major developments at Rumboldswhyke Primary School that will bring even more energy, engagement and community spirit into school life.

### **New School Houses**

Our children have chosen four animals from the Bible to represent our new school houses: the Bear, the Lion, the Eagle and the Deer. Each house will have its own motto and a linked Bible verse (which we will share soon). On Monday the children will find out which house they belong to! Siblings will be in the same house, and parent governors will be aligned with the house of their child too. This means our whole school family, pupils, siblings, parents and governors, can come together under symbol, motto and shared values.

### Launching Taskmaster Club

More exciting news: we are introducing a special initiative inspired by the Taskmaster

format: the Taskmaster Club. This will serve as the first whole-school event for our new houses, and will eventually become a regular after-school club.

## Online Safety Update: Concerns Around Certain Roblox Games

We would like to make parents and carers aware of some concerns regarding specific games currently circulating on **Roblox**. Although Roblox has a general maturity rating of 5+, it is important to note that individual games (known as "experiences") on the platform can vary widely in content, and many are not appropriate for young children despite the overall platform rating.



## Five Nights at Freddy's - Inspired Content

Several Roblox experiences are based on *Five Nights* at *Freddy's* (FNaF). While these versions are usercreated and vary in style, the themes they draw from the original game are not suitable for primary-aged children.

The original *Five Nights at Freddy's* is a **survival horror** game known for being one of the most frightening video game series of its kind.

Even toned-down Roblox versions can still contain imagery, sounds and themes that can be **very distressing** for younger children. We have had reports of children becoming anxious or upset after playing these types of games at home.

## "99 Nights in the Forest"

Another Roblox game we wish to highlight is 99 Nights in the Forest, which is labelled as **Minimal Risk** under Roblox's maturity settings. However, this can be misleading.

Children build camps, gather resources, and survive encounters in a dark forest environment. While not as intense as FNaF-inspired games, it **may still be too frightening** for younger children or those sensitive to suspense and dark themes.

#### Why This Matters

These types of games can affect children in different ways. Some may brush them off, while others may become:

- anxious at bedtime
- · fearful of the dark
- preoccupied with alarming images
- worried about being alone
- unsettled by loud or sudden noises

We therefore encourage all families to regularly review the games children are playing online.

Our priority is always the wellbeing and safety of our children, both in school and online. Please do reach out to us if you would like further guidance on online safety or if you have concerns about what your child may be accessing at home.

## <u>Green Class' trip to the Weald and Downland</u> Museum


