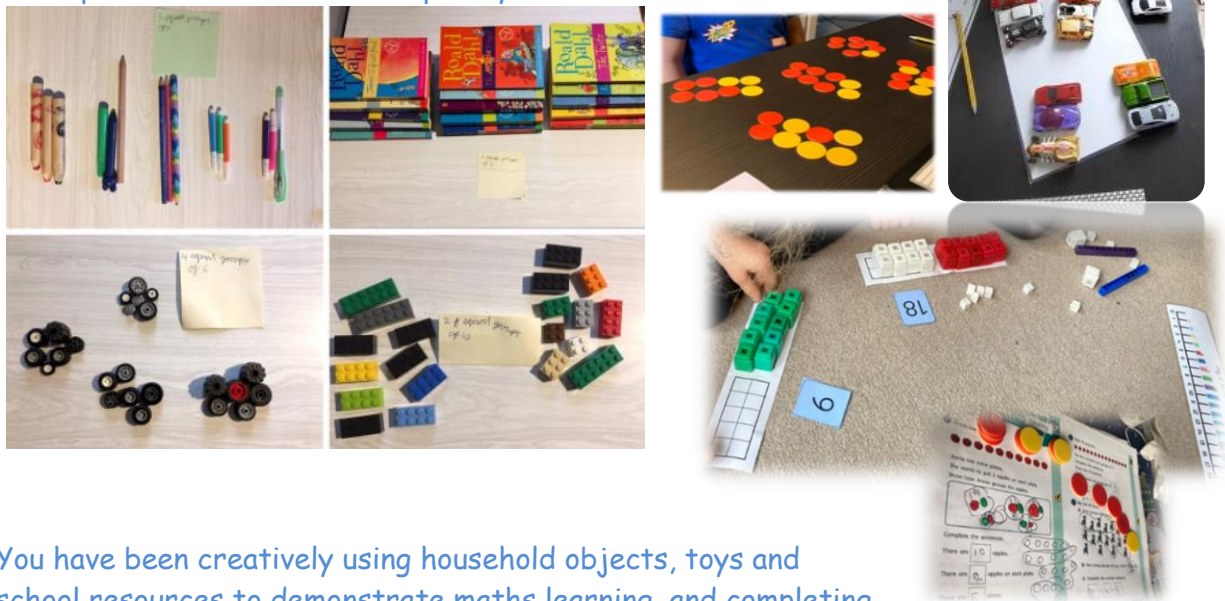


Dear Rumboldswyke families,

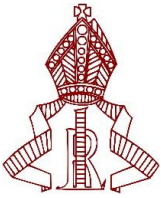
