Exciting developments have been happening at Rumboldswhyke this week. With the support of the Bishop Luffa team and Business for Schools, we have developed one of our unused spaces into a beautiful area where children will be able to come and get lost in a book or research an area of their learning. How incredibly lucky are we to have the support, knowledge and skills of a local Secondary school? We feel blessed and nurtured by the Team.

A huge thank you to the Business2Schools Team who work tirelessly sourcing furniture and stationary from companies around the country, who are rehoming and recycling their office equipment. We have been donated beautiful bookshelves, chairs, tables, beanbags and top of the range laptops for our children to use.





We are not quite ready for the big reveal to the children yet, but we thought you may enjoy an early preview of the progress made.

This week in their Forest School session, the children in Reception and Year 1 had the opportunity to work as a team, constructing a shelter.









Each group worked well and chose a different way of securing their shelter. They were so engaged in the task that they continued to improve their designs even during the 10 minutes free play at the end.

Next Tuesday will be the turn of the Year 2's. We cannot wait to see the ingenious shelter designs they come up with.
