Up until July it was the responsibility of the school to undertake the Track and Trace process of identifying close contacts, and since then the government has taken on this role. However, we feel it only fair to keep you informed if we have any cases within school. We will not identify individuals but will keep you updated about cases and new mitigations accordingly.

We have been incredibly fortunate and avoided any positive cases in school since the beginning of the pandemic. Unfortunately, I have tested positive for COVID-19 today so will not be in school for at least the next week. I had been identified as a close contact and as such I wore a face mask in school on Tuesday and limited my movements around the school to reduce the risk of transmission. In my absence Mrs Toy, Mrs Flint and the rest of the wonderful team are being supported by Mr Hindman to ensure the usual running of the school.

To minimise the impact of this and in line with our risk assessment, the following precautions have been put into place.

- All staff have been advised to take a lateral flow test daily.
- Staff are wearing face masks in all communal areas
