Youth Worship at Bishop Luffa – Year 3

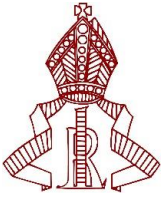

Humility is our value of the month for March

Humility REFLECTION POINTS

- Humility is being happy with who I am.
- Humility is not boasting.
- Humility is not trying to impress people.
- Humility is putting others first.

In worship, children will be:

- Considering what Humility means.
- Discussing famous people who are good role models in showing Humility.

At home you may like to look at the story of 'The Tortoise and the Hare' together as a family and talk about the moral behind the story. You could encourage your children to acknowledge the things they are good at, be proud of these things and think how they can use their strengths to help other people. Look out for times when children are helpful around the house without being told or expecting a reward and respond with loads of praise.
