This week in the news, a report has been published regarding attendance:

'Government data shows one in five pupils were persistently absent from school last year, with an attendance gap widening' (SchoolsWeek)

We have certainly seen a huge dip in attendance since Covid and the above statistic is also true of the children at Rumboldswhyke. 1 in 5 (over 20%) were classed as persistently absent last year. Children who are late are also included in this statistic. This has a **detrimental impact** on their attainment. I track children's attainment and directly compare this to their attendance figures and the correlation is clear. Children need to be at school, on time, to make good progress.

Having said that, we seem to have a bug in school with a number of children spiking temperatures or having upset tummies. Hopefully, after a weekend of rest, they should be feeling much better on Monday morning. Obviously if children are feeling unwell, they should not be at school. However, if they have a cough or a cold, you no longer need to keep them at home to isolate them.

#### School Council Elections

On Monday, we will be relaunching the School Council, with elections being held next Friday. Should your child wish to



run for election, they may bring home a form to complete. Children in Key Stage 2 may also bring home other application forms for additional responsibilities:

Year 5: librarian (with training from the Bishop Luffa librarians), shed monitor, lunch supervisor, worship support

Year 3 / 4: Play leaders

#### Hot Meal Ordering
